Seeking Graduate Research Assistants – Paid Position

We are seeking **paid research assistants** to work 10 hours per week. This position is available as of August 28, 2017 (start of fall 2017 semester).

DUTIES:

- Conduct research activities with a team of students, staff, and faculty. Research is focused on issues related to prisoner reentry programming and policy reforms.
- Investigate academic literature and other credible internet resources for cutting edge science and innovations.
- Help with data management, data analysis (if applicable), and data collection (e.g., interviewing study participants) of ongoing research studies.
- Assist with grant preparation.
- Participate in trainings with computer partners.
- Project specific tasks as needed.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- Interest in criminal justice policy or practice innovations.
- Seeking a Master's Degree in Public Health or Social Work.
- Outstanding organizational skills, patience, and ability to manage multiple tasks.
- Excellent interpersonal and professional skills, both in person and by phone.
- Attention to detail and follow-thru with the ability to work independently AND with team members.
- Prior research or criminal justice related experience are preferred.
